

• Deferred payment loans and closing cost assistance


Homelessness activities:

SDHC - City of San Diego FY 2022 AHF Workshop AHF Rental Housing Development Timeline












SDHC - City of San Diego FY 2022 AHF Workshop FY15 - FY20 AHF Program Expenditures






SDHC - City of San Diego FY 2022 AHF Workshop FY15 – FY20 Homelessness Programs
