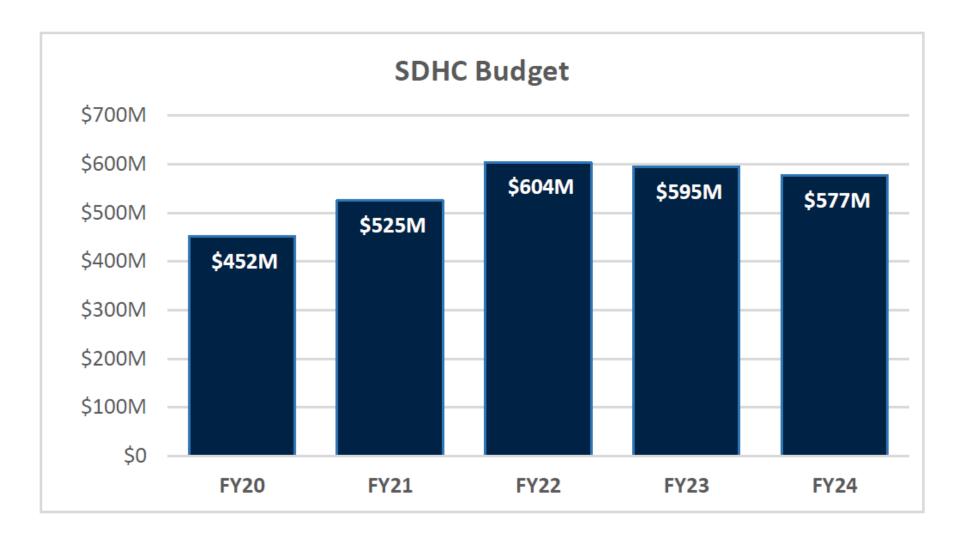

SDHC – FY 2024 Proposed Budget Objectives, Deliverables and Uses of Funds

Provide Rental Assistance to Households with Low Income:

- Dedicate \$224.7 million to assist more than 17,000 households.
- Continue supportive housing programs: Assist populations, such as individuals experiencing chronic homelessness, individuals with serious mental illness experiencing homelessness, and transition-age youth.
- Assist 500 households by allocating more than \$10 million to the Emergency Housing Voucher Program.
- Lease 449 new Project-Based Voucher units for households with low income or experiencing homelessness in Fiscal Year 2024.
- Continue Landlord Partnership Program to attract and retain landlords to the rental assistance program.
- Help families to become more financially self-reliant through the SDHC Achievement Academy, a learning and resource center and computer lab.





SDHC – FY 2024 Proposed Budget Objectives, Deliverables and Uses of Funds (Continued)

Create and Preserve Affordable Housing:

- Award up to \$29 million to developers to create 290 new permanent affordable housing units.
- Continue to own and/or manage 4,120 affordable housing units in the City of San Diego.
- Invest \$7 million to rehabilitate up to 800 SDHC-owned units.
- Dedicate \$4.5 million to help up to 35 households become first-time homebuyers.
- Award \$2 million to San Diegans for the creation of up to eight Accessory Dwelling Units.





SDHC – FY 2024 Proposed Budget Objectives, Deliverables and Uses of Funds (Continued)

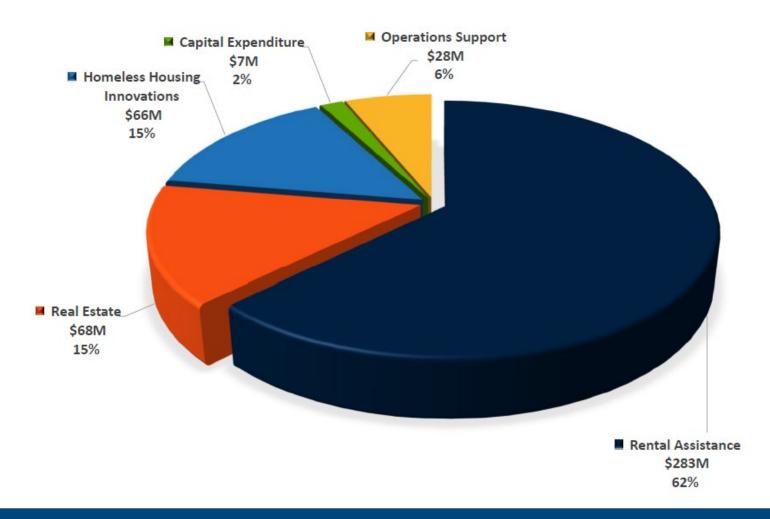
Address Homelessness:

- Dedicate \$151.1 million to address homelessness in the City of San Diego, including:
 - Further the goals of the Community Action Plan on Homelessness for the City of San Diego by allocating \$4 million for Rapid Rehousing, \$2.1 million for the Homelessness Response Center, and \$3.7 million for other Supportive Services programs.
 - Continue to grow HOUSING FIRST SAN DIEGO with \$4.2 million toward Landlord Engagement, \$4 million toward Housing Instability Prevention Program (HIPP), and \$4.9 million for Prevention and Diversion.
 - Administer \$21.8 million toward Bridge Shelters, \$14.2 million toward Interim Shelters, and
 \$4.2 million for Continuum of Care Permanent Supportive Housing.

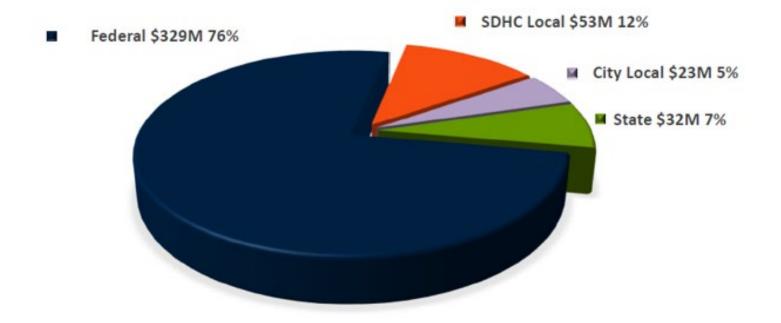
