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SDHC Achievement Academy Rental Assistance Division Overview

San Diego Housing Commission

- Section 8 Housing Choice Vouchers (HCV): 15,398
- SDHC's HCV waiting list: 91,000 families

Demographics

- Average Annual Income (HCV Families): \$18,470
- 59% of families are elderly or disabled
- 41% of families are work-able





SDHC Achievement Academy Path to Success

- Path to Success, SDHC Moving to Work (MTW) program, effective July 1, 2013.
- Modified the method used to determine the monthly rent payment amounts for Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher rental assistance participants and public housing residents.
- Set minimum monthly rent payment amounts for program participants who are identified as able to work (Work-Able). No minimum monthly rent for elderly/disabled households.
- Minimum rents based on California's minimum wage standards— \$8/hour at the time the program was implemented.
- SDHC guides Work-Able families to become more financially selfreliant through enrollment at the SDHC Achievement Academy.





SDHC Achievement Academy Introduction

- The SDHC Achievement Academy is a 9,600-square-foot learning and resource center with a computer lab.
- Services provided in three core areas:
 - Employment placement and career improvement
 - Personal financial education and coaching
 - Access to income supports

SDHC Achievement Academy Services Provided

- Work readiness workshops
- Access to on-site and off-site job
 skills training
- Financial education and counseling
- Family Self-Sufficiency program
- Access to government benefits programs

- Weekly employer recruitments
- Computer training free access to computers on-site
- Soft skills
- Specialized programs(Multigenerational and Single parent)

SDHC Achievement Academy

Commission Core Program – Family Self-Sufficiency (FSS)

- Voluntary, two-year program
- Requires a Career Plan
- Must obtain a job working at least 32 hours per week and off assistance
- Able to earn up to \$10,000 in an interest-bearing escrow account
 - Increase in income will go into account, rather than toward rent
 - Financial benchmarks (Example: Receiving your GED, Employment, and Job Retention)
 - 339 clients are currently enrolled
- SDHC Achievement Academy receives \$407,000 a year from HUD to provide case management services

SDHC Achievement Academy Book-Rich Environment

- 13,000 new books given to families
- 3 targeted communities: City Heights, Barrio Logan and San Ysidro

SDHC Achievement Academy EnVision Center Update

- On June 7, 2018, HUD selected EnVision Centers to promote financial self-reliance among federal rental assistance recipients and public housing residents.
- Only 18 EnVision Centers nationwide
- San Diego EnVision Center Community roundtable meetings held on July 25, 2018
- Rent space at South Metro Career Center
- Partners: San Diego Workforce Partnership, Faith-Based
 Organizations and Promise Zone Community partners
- Anticipate Open House in 2019
- Hired new Workforce Readiness Specialist





- W. K. Kellogg Foundation grant helps provide training for all participants
 - \$780,000 for three years
 - Service 60 2Gen families in City Heights
 - Kids up to 8 years old
 - Four impact areas:
 - Health and Wellness
 - Financial Stability
 - Social Capital
 - Education and Employment
 - In final year of program





SDHC Achievement Academy Kellogg 2 Gen Program

Financial Stability

- 27% increase in income by at least 20%
- 27% decrease in assistance
- 63% increase in FICO score

Health & Wellness

- 100% families enrolled in health insurance
- 96% had annual Well Child and dental check-ups
- 146 individuals participated in YMCA activities

Education/Employment

- 54% obtained employment
- Majority of children were absent from school for 3 days or less
- 70% of children performing at grade level

Social Capital

• 44% engage in community activities





SDHC Achievement Academy Youth Programs

- Creative Industries Workforce Program
 - Provides job skills training and placement for
 Opportunity Youth (ages 16-24), preparing them for
 creative technology careers, such as graphic design,
 web design and multimedia through an "earn to learn"
 model
 - 10 youth were placed in a paid internship
 - Each received graphic design tablet
- 192 youth received SDHC Achievement Academy services in FY 2018
 - 65 placed in jobs
 - 14 placed in vocational training





SDHC Achievement Academy Power of One

 Power of One is a yearlong program for single parents who currently receive federal rental assistance and have children age 16 and younger.
