

Up to \$16.6 Million Available to Preserve Affordable Housing

Multifamily Housing, including Single-Room Occupancy (SRO) properties, may be eligible

The San Diego Housing Commission (SDHC) anticipates issuing a Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) in June 2021 to make up to \$16.6 million available to preserve affordable multifamily rental housing developments, specifically naturally occurring affordable housing (NOAH), in the City of San Diego.

SDHC will award these funds as forgivable loans in exchange for long-term restrictions that require the property to remain affordable for households with low income.

The available funds may be used for:

- Predevelopment and residential rehabilitation (including temporary relocation activities) of existing unrestricted NOAH properties, including SRO properties, in the City of San Diego; or
- Addition of restrictions requiring affordability on existing NOAH properties, including SRO properties, in the City of San Diego, if the applicant demonstrates that rehabilitation is not needed.

This NOFA does not include rental housing vouchers.

Required Training
