#### **SUMMARY**

This report has been prepared in response to the Housing Authority of the City of San Diego's Resolution Number HA-1569 granting the San Diego Housing Commission (Housing Commission) authority for a number of grant-related activities and requiring submission of a semi-annual report of all grant activity.

#### **Grant Activity**

During the first half of Fiscal Year 2021 (July 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020), the Housing Commission received notices of decision for five grants totaling more than \$39.4 million. The Housing Commission was awarded two new grants totaling \$37.7 million, and three renewal grants totaling more than \$1.7 million. Three applications totaling more than \$9.1 million are still pending notice of decision. Below are the details of this grant activity.
