SDHC completed a study to analyze vacancies among homes in the City of San Diego as a potential factor in the city's housing crisis. We published the report, "Residential Vacancies in


The study identified less than 1 percent of residential housing units were vacant for at least six consecutive months at some point during a five-year period before the COVID-19

This study provides important data—based on best practices from similar studies in other communities—to inform discussions and decision making as the City of San Diego continues

To help determine the extent to which homes are vacant in San Diego, the SDHC Board of Commissioners directed SDHC staff to commence this study to identify units vacant for six
